



Choose a 'Secure' Password

Passwords provide the first line of defense against unauthorized access to your computer. The stronger your password, the more protected your computer will be from hackers and malicious software. You should make sure you have strong passwords for all accounts on your computer.

Use the entire keyboard, not just the letters and characters you use or see most often. » **Do not use personal information.**

You should never use personal information as a part of your password. It is very easy for someone to guess things like your last name, pet's name, child's birth date and other similar details. » **Think of a phrase that is easy for you to recall and use acronyms.**

Use the first letter of each word in a phrase that is easy to recall to create a password. Be extra safe by including symbols like pound or dollar signs or numbers in the middle of the password or between letters.

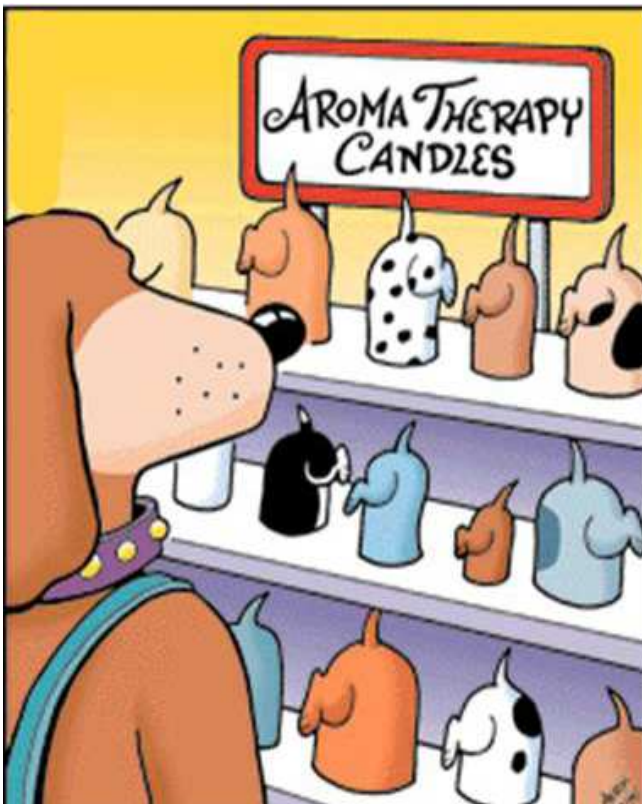
Relate your password to a favorite hobby or sport. For example, I love to play badminton could become ILuv2PlayB@dm1nt(n). » **Whenever possible, use at least 14 characters or more for password**

Definition of computer terms

WORM:

A Worm is a malicious program that spreads itself without any user intervention. Worms spread without attaching to or infecting other programs and files. A Worm can spread across computer networks via security holes on vulnerable machines connected to the network and also through email by sending copies of itself to everyone in the user's address book. A Worm may consume a large amount of system resources and cause the machine to become noticeably sluggish and unreliable.

TROJAN:

A destructive program that masquerades as a benign application. Unlike viruses, Trojan horses do not replicate themselves but they can be just as destructive. One of the most insidious types of Trojan horse is a program that claims to rid your computer of viruses but instead introduces viruses onto your computer.

BACKDOOR:

A Backdoor is a software program that gives an attacker unauthorized access to a machine and the means for remotely controlling the machine without the user's knowledge. A Backdoor compromises system integrity by making changes to the system that allow it to be used by the attacker for malicious purposes unknown to the user.

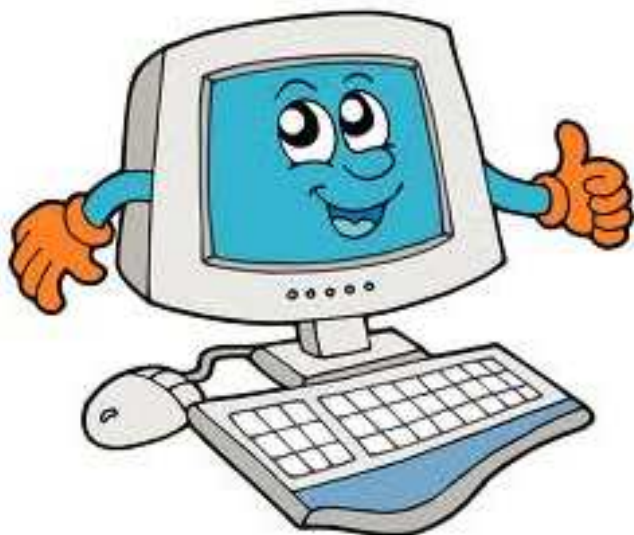

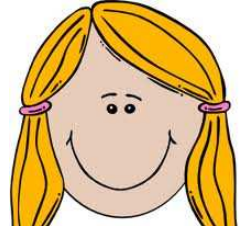
